About Us

Camp HOPE America, Safe Futures is a camping and group mentorship program for children in Southeastern, CT who have been impacted by trauma. Our mission is to help children exposed to trauma find pathways to hope and healing.

CAMP

We facilitate 1 week of overnight camp in the summer at Camp Fuller in Wakefield, RI. Camp Fuller is accredited by the American Camping Association. Throughout the week campers have an opportunity to try a variety of activities such as archery, arts and crafts, swimming, and much more.

PATHWAYS

Campers build strong friendships during their week at camp. They can stay connected through Pathways, a group mentorship program that meets once a month. Through Pathways, campers get to have fun, try new things, and continue to build on the hope skills they learn at camp.



Campers participate in a variety of activities ranging from field games to rock climbing, and arts and crafts to campfire songs.

Frequently Asked Questions

What age children can participate?

Children ages 7-15 can enroll in the program. All children enrolled in the program can participate through 17 years old.

How much does it cost?

There is no cost for families to participate in Camp HOPE. With the help of generous donors, supports, and donations, Safe Futures is able to cover the cost of camp tuition and provide camp supplies to each camper.

Safety at camp

Safe Futures and Camp Fuller work together to provide a low staff-to-camper ratio to ensure all campers have a safe, fun, and hope-filled camp experience. Staff is always present and easily accessible to meet camper's needs 24 hrs, including medical needs through Camp Fuller's Health Center. Each cabin of 6 campers will be staffed by two counselors, one HOPE counselor and one Camp Fuller counselor. All summer staff has received various levels of training in child development, camp safety and emergency preparedness, behavior management, and much more.
